
Integrated Monarch Monitoring Program (IMMP)







The IMMP uses a random sampling design to select monitoring sites in an unbiased way to monitor monarchs and evaluate their habitats to inform monarch conservation efforts. After attending the training, you may choose to assist with monitoring at BNC's Rivers' Edge, to adopt a random IMMP site (see back), or select your own 1+ acre site.

At this training event, you will learn:

- ♦ Status and conservation of monarchs
- ◆ Development and purpose of the IMMP
 - ♦ How to select a site to monitor
- ♦ How to submit data to the national database
- How to monitor milkweed, nectar plants, and monarch eggs and larva*


